

13KM SAFEGUARDING ZONE WILDLIFE HAZARD MANAGEMENT Induction Course for Construction Site Personnel

Course Duration:

Two (2) hours, including multiple-choice test

Purpose of course:

In accordance with good practice, this course ensures that key personnel with responsibility for wildlife hazard management on a development site within 13km of an aerodrome, have an awareness of how they can support minimisation of elevated wildlife hazard risks.

The course provides evidence of knowledge in the delivery of good practice in wildlife hazard management and can be used as a regular proficiency check e.g. annually.

Target Audience:

This course is intended for a site manager, or a suitable delegate, with responsibility for day-to-day operational wildlife hazard management on a development site within 13km of an aerodrome.

Course Content:

The course content follows the principles in EASA's Guidance Material at GM3 ADR.OPS.B.020 to provide a basic understanding of the following general areas:

- (1) The nature and extent of aviation wildlife management problems and the factors influencing wildlife hazard risks for an aerodrome;
- (2) The national and local regulations, standards, and good practice relating to wildlife hazard management;
- (3) Pragmatic techniques to meet key performance indicators in a site wildlife hazard management plan using a mix of the following:
 - a. Long-term (passive) management measures;
 - b. Short-term (active) tactical measures, using well established effective wildlife removal, dispersal, and management techniques;
- (4) The required documentation and reporting procedures in accordance with the site wildlife hazard management plan;

Courses will be delivered with reference to local factors of influence on wildlife and hazard management issues for a development site.

The course is classroom based and, where applicable, the course will include a variety of media and presentation techniques.

The course will incorporate a short multiple-choice test (not open-book) with a set target pass grade.

All attendees receive a copy of the course documentation along with a signed certificate for attendance.

Note: The basic induction course does not include training in specialist equipment e.g. agrilasers and bioacoustics. Please ask for further details if required.

Learning Objectives:

At the end of the training course, attendees should have an appreciation of the following:

- An understanding of the concepts and principles of wildlife hazard management on a development site within 13km of an aerodrome;
- Wildlife hazard management standards and recommended practices (SARPs)
